 - a. Write the topic sentence: the first aspect of the object.
 - b. Provide the reader with the description of the aspect, mentioned in topic sentence.
2. Second paragraph
 - a. Use a transition from the first paragraph.
 - b. Write the topic sentence: second aspect of the object.
 - c. Provide the reader with the description of the aspect, mentioned in topic sentence.
3. Third paragraph
 - a. Use a transition from the second paragraph.
 - b. Write the topic sentence: third aspect of the object.
 - c. Provide the reader with the description of the aspect, mentioned in topic sentence.

III. CONCLUSION

- a. Restate your thesis statement.
- b. Summarize the description of the object.
