


WHAT IS A MUTATION?

When a change occurs to the genetic information of a cell, the cell experiences something called a **MUTATION**. Mutations are responsible for genetic diversity. And while mutations can be bad, they also can be good. **MUTATIONS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL NEW TYPES OF BEING ON EARTH.**

POINT MUTATIONS

POINT MUTATIONS are mutations that affect a single nucleotide. These types of mutations typically result in a **SUBSTITUTION** where one nucleotide is changed to a different nucleotide. If these mutations occur within a gene, it may be transmitted to the offspring and over future generations. If the mutation results in a phenotype that leaves the individual we call this a **POINT MUTATION** or **GENOTYPIC MUTATION**.

SICKLE-CELL MUTATION is an example of a point mutation. In the case of sickle-cell disease, the change of a single nucleotide within the DNA changes the code within the mRNA and ultimately the protein for hemoglobin. The result is a sickle-shaped red blood cell. Another disease that is caused by a point mutation is Cystic fibrosis, resulting in the tragic death of some young athletes.
