

# Essay Writing Guide



## Introduction:

1. **Hook:** Capture the reader's attention. You can...
  - a. Ask an interesting question related to your essay topic.
  - b. Use a quote or dialogue that is related to your essay topic.
  - c. Use a sound word and describe a situation related to your topic.
2. **Background:** You can...
  - a. Begin to connect your hook to the topic of your essay.
  - b. Give a short summary of the story.
3. **Thesis Statement:** Write the thesis statement you created from your essay outline. In one sentence, answer the essay prompt/question.

## Body Paragraphs:

1. **Topic Sentence:** What is the (first) (second) (third) reason for the theme of your story. Make sure it is general and not too specific.
2. **Evidence:** Give a direct quote from the story supporting your topic sentence.
  - a. Pick a signal phrase to start it: In the text it says, \_\_\_\_ OR For example, it says \_\_\_\_
  - b. Then write your sentence from the story word for word. Make sure to put quotations marks around it.
  - c. It should look like this: In the text it says, "My grandma was the best person who ever lived."
3. **Explain your evidence:**
  - a. Restate what the quote said in your own words.
  - b. Then explain. How is the theme shown by this part of the story? This part should be, **at least 3 sentences.**
4. **Sum it up:**
  - a. Restate this body paragraph's main point, your topic sentence.
  - b. Insert a transition to connect to the next body paragraph.
